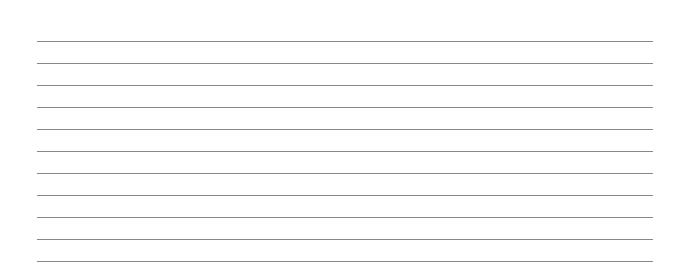

Summarizing a Text

What is a summary?

A summary is a brief statement or account of the <u>main points</u> of a text. Another name for summary is a "synopsis."

What is included in a summary?

A good summary includes the main idea and <u>only</u> the major points that support the main idea. The supporting details in the summary must be relevant to the entire article and not just a piece of it.

What is a Main Idea?

The main idea of an article is the overall point of the article, usually expressed in one sentence. For example, if you're reading an article that lists tips to help you protect yourself from COVID-19, the main idea would probably be this: There are several steps you can take to protect yourself from being infected with COVID-19.

Your Assignment: Research an article over a topic of your choice. You may search for articles using your phone, internet, book, magazine, or newspaper. Write a summary of the article that includes the main idea and most important supporting details. Write down the topic, title of the

article, author's name (if provided), publication date (if provided), title of publication, and publication type (book, magazine, internet).
